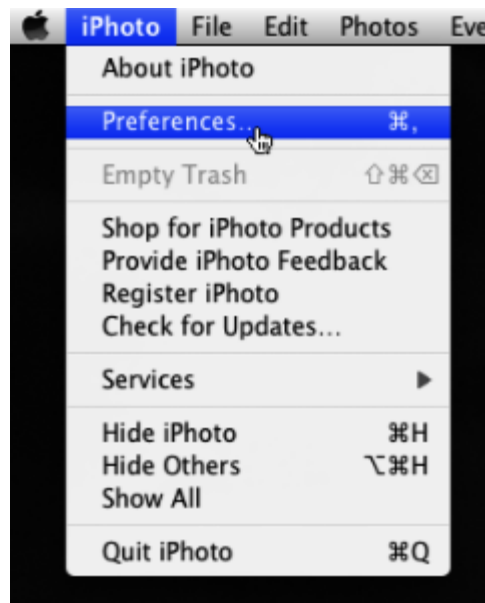


# iPhoto Easy "Event" & Aperture Easy Folder Creation

An easy way to create events in iPhoto & Aperture

## 1st Time Only: Open iPhoto Preferences

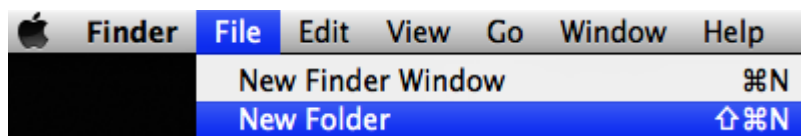


## 1st Time Only: Set your Mac NOT to OPEN an APP on Camera Attachment



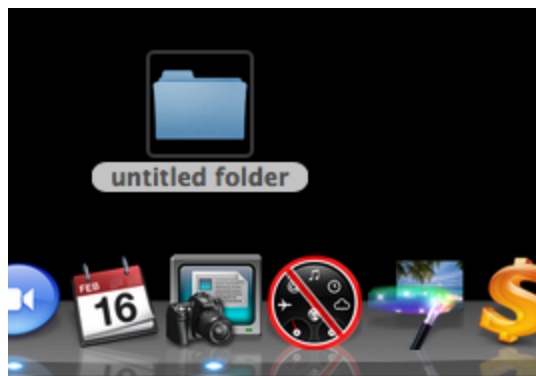
Then CLOSE iPhoto. Your MAC default setting will now be to NOT open any APP when a camera or camera card is attached. You won't have to repeat these first two steps again.

## Create a Folder on Your Desktop



The new Folder on your Desktop will be Named "Untitled Folder"

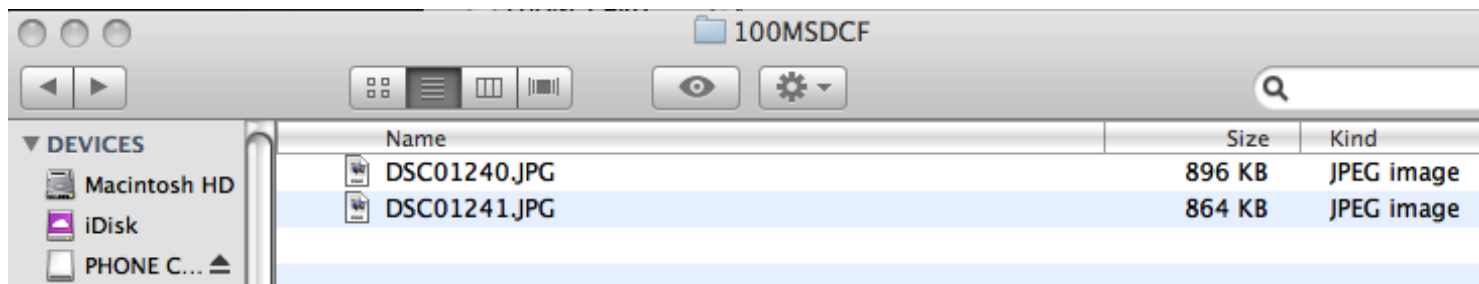
## Find "Untitled Folder" on your Desktop



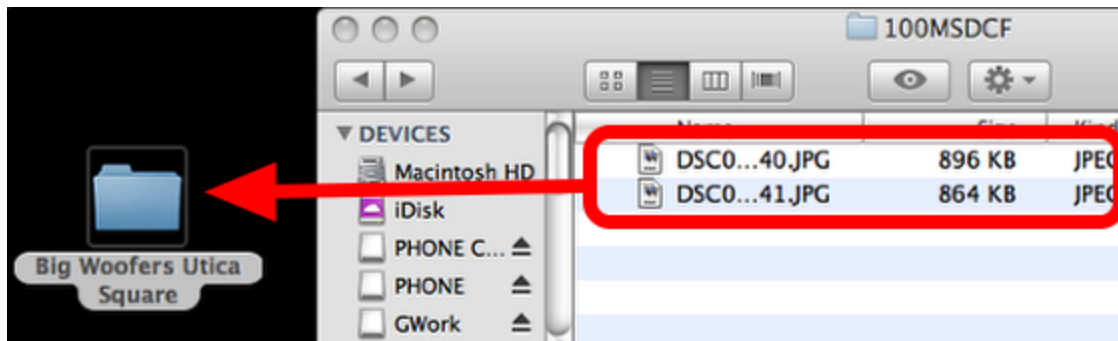
## Rename "Untitled Folder" as you want the iPhoto EVENT named



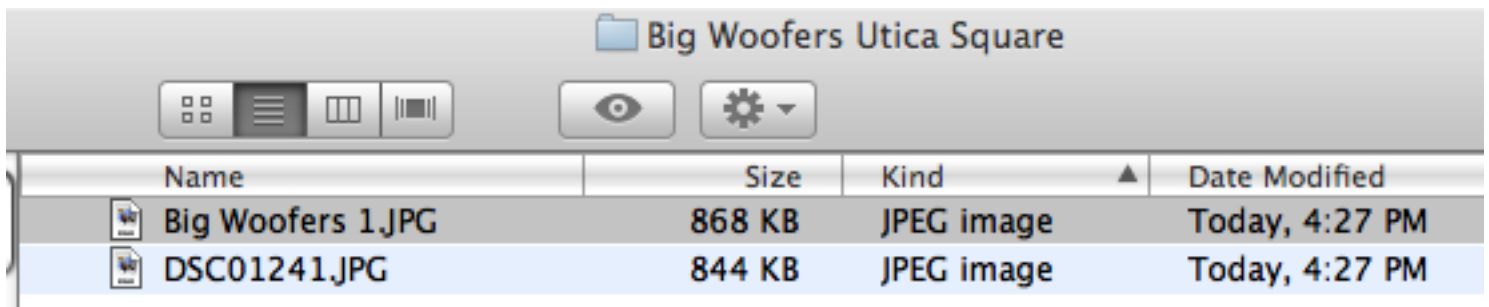
## Connect the Camera or Camera Card



## Drag Pics from Your Camera Card to Folder



## OPTIONAL: Rename Your Pics



Don't leave your grandchildren with the digital equivalent of an old shoebox filled with photos of people no one can identify.

With only two pictures, it is just as easy to rename them manually.

BEFORE sending your pictures to iPhoto or Aperture is a good time to Preview them and Bart out the losers!

Simply DRAG the Renamed Folder onto the iPhoto Icon in the Dock - iPhoto does not have to be open

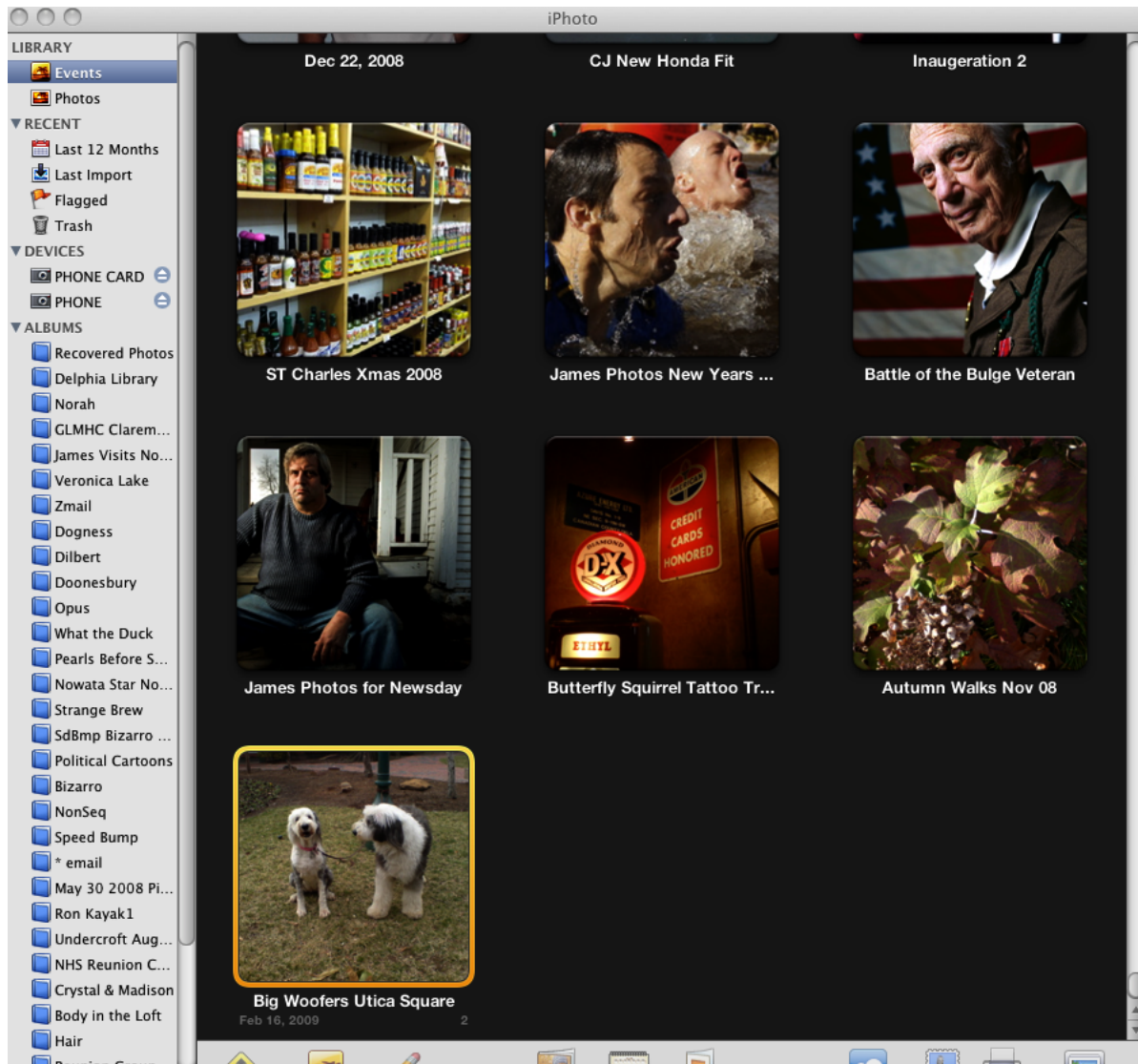


then let it go. iPhoto imports the Pictures and Creates an EVENT with the same name as the FOLDER

## Here's the "Big Woofers Event" in Event View



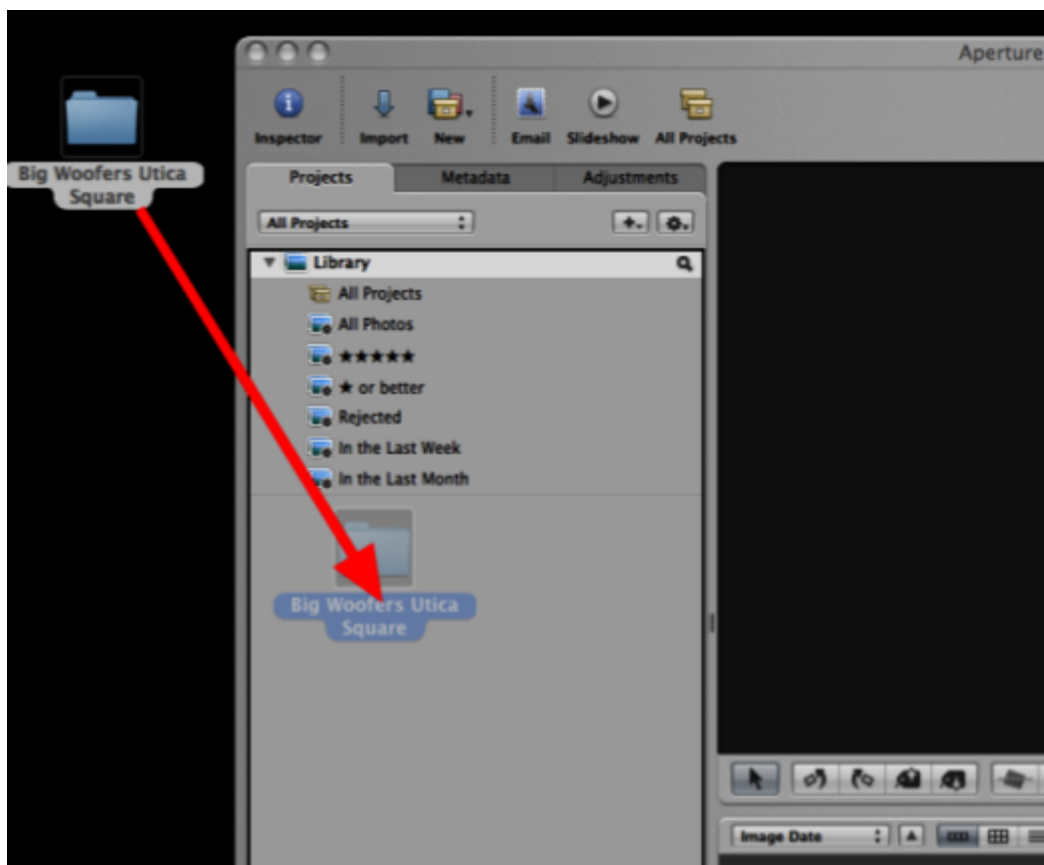
Aperture in the next step -
